Haye Wharfe Lane In the Parish of Greate Alhallowes

The Ground Plott or ffirst Story

Eight Tenements with thappurtenances lyeing together in Heywharfe Lane in the Parish of Greate Alhallowes in Thames streate in London, abutting East vppon a watercourse Leadeing from Thames streate towards the Thames and Conteyne in Length 140 foote 10 Inches of assize, On the west vppon the lane called Heywharfe and doe Containe in Length 140 foote 6 Inches of assize, On the north vppon the Tenements belonging to the Company of Marchant Taylors sometye in the tennure of George Querneby, and doe contayne in bredth 19 foote 5 Inches of assize, And on the Sowth vppon the Tenements belonging to the Company of Clothworkers in the Tennure of Abraham Campion and doe Contayne in bredth 19 foote 10 Inches of assize All which are now in the Tennure of William Campion

A Chamber devided into two partes with two Chimneys cont: in Length 20 foote $\frac{1}{2}$, and in bredth 17 foote $\frac{1}{2}$

A Chamber ouer the Chamber aforesayed Cont: in Length 20 foote $\frac{1}{2}$ & in bredth 17 foote $\frac{1}{2}$, with a halfe Garrett ouer the same

A Chamber next the sayed Lane Conteyning in Length 13 foote $\frac{1}{2}$, and in bredth 10 foote $\frac{1}{2}$

Third Story

Two Chambers both conteyning in Length 23 foote and in bredth 17 foote $\frac{1}{2}$ with a Chimney Also a halfe Garrett ouer the same.

A Chamber with a Chimney conteyning in Length from East to West 20 foote and in bredth 17 foote with the staires and chimney

Third Story

Another Chamber being devided into two partes conteyning in Length 20 foote and in bredth 17 foote

A Garrett ouer the Chamber aforesayed conteyning in Length 20 foote and in bredth 17 foote./.

One other Tenement wherein dwell diverse widdowes

The Second Story

A Chamber divided into diverse parcells wherein dwell diverse widdowes Cont: in Length 20 foote and in bredth 17 foote

The Third Story

Another Chamber in two partes with two Chimneys, which Chamber cont in Length 23 foote and in bredth 17 foote

Also a Garrett ouer the same with a Chimney in it

A Chamber divided into diverse partes conteyning in Length 23 foote $\frac{1}{2}$ and in bredth 17 foote

The Third Story

Two Chambers with two Chimneys both conteining in Length 22 foote $\frac{1}{2}$, and in bredth 17 foote

Also a halfe Garrett ouer the same of the Like bignes.

Haye Wharfe alias Haywharfe Lane In the same Parish

All that messuage called or knowne by the name of the Brewhouse and two Tenements sometye in Twelue Tenements sett lyeing and being in the Parish of Alhallowes aforesayed abutting East vpon a watercourse Called Wolsey Lane Contayning from North to South 214 foote ½ of assize, And doe Contayne in Length from North to Sowth alongest on the west syd alongest by the Landes Late Lambert 176 foote of assize, and doe contayne in bredth at the north end from East to west with the way of the lane called Heywharfe Lane That is to say from the Landes of the sayed Lambert to the sayed lane or watercourse called Wolsey Lane 62 foote and 5 Inches of assize And in bredth from East to west at the south end alonge by the Thames syd 52 foote 7 Inches od assize as more plainely appeareth by the Plott

On the East syd

A faire Parlor with a Chimney conteyning in Length from north 26 foote, and in bredth with the Chimney 21 foote ½

A Buttry adioyning to the same conteyning in Length 20 foote ½ and in bredth 15 foote

A Longe Lofte or warehowse cont in Length 54 foote ½ and in bredth 23 foote

The Third Story on the west syd

Two Chambers with two Chimneyes cont: in Length 40 foote and in bredth 33 foote

A faire Chamber with a Chimney conteyning in Length 30 foote and in bredth 17 foote

A Gallary ouer parte of the hall and ouer parte of the parlor ouer the yarde Cont: in Length 30 foote and in bredth at the east ende 30 foote and at the west end 11 foote

On the East syd

A lofte or warehowse conteyning in Length 54 foote ½ and in bredth 21 foote ½

A faire Chamber ouer the Greate Parlor aforesayed conteyning in Length from north to South 27 foote and from East to west with the Chimney 22 foote ½

The ffowrth Story on the East syd

A longe Garrett ouer the Lofte or warehowse aforesayed

Two Chambers with two Chimneys conteining in length 30 foote and in bredth 22 foote

A viewe and Survay taken the xxxth day of July 1612

In the presence of Mr ffoxe Master of the worshipfull company of Clothworkers Mr Beale Mr Parkhurst Mr Hodges wardens Mr Gaillor Mr Raphe Treswell the elder Surveyor, Thomas Haydon Carpenter and John Morgan Bricklayer of all the Landes and tenements belonging to the Company of Clothworkers and now in the tenure of Mr William Campion Clothworker lyeing & being in Haywharfe Lane in Thames streate in London the measures butts and boundings being examined, were founde to agree in all thinges mencioned in the Counterpaine of Mr Campions Lease, and with Mr Campions Lease it selfe also, as heere after ffolloweth

Inprimis one capitall messuage and two Tenements with the wharfe and yardes being sometyme in twelue Tenements and parcell of the lands aforesayed doe containe in bredth at the south end alonge by the watersyd 52 foote 7 Inches of assize, at either corner of which bredth is a peice of brasse plate fixed and sett vp with the same of (Clothworkers) therein engrauen, Item from South to North on the East syd alonge by the lane called Wolsy lane in length 214 foote $\frac{1}{2}$, at which place other Tenements doe adioyne therefore noe plate is fixed there, Item in Length from south to north on the west syd alonge by the Landes late...Lamberts 176 foote of assize, and there also on the west post of the gate is another platt of brasse fixed and set vp Item in bredth from East to west at the north end with the way of the lane called Heywharfe Lane, from Wolsey lane to the landes late Lamberts 62 foote of assize at the west end of which building is another plate fixed and sett vp, And againe at the north end of all the sayed Tenements in Hay wharfe Lane alonge by the Landes of the Marchantaylors being the vtmost boundes of the sayed company of Clothworkers landes, is two plates fixed and sett vp on the two corner postes of the howse there.
